Salem Colonel Gets Silver Star for Guerrilla Warfare

Col. Charles W. Hedges, whose wife resides at 2330 Hayden ave., Salem, has been awarded the Silver Star medal "for gallantry in action against the enemy in Lanao province, Mindanao, Philippine islands, during the period of November, 1942, to March, 1944. Displaying personal fearlessness," according to the

citation, "and superb leadership and demonstrating his tactical skill, determination and bravery under fire, he organized and personally led a guerrilla division through the darkest period of Philippine history."

"Time after time he put himself in combat at the head of his men, during three different invasions by the Japanese. His excellent leadership was the major role eventually driving the Japanese from the province. His patriotism is only exceeded by his personal courage and professional skill. The heroic action of Colonel Hedges is in keeping with the highest tradition of the military service," the citation concludes.

Ensign Olcott Said Liberated

Ensign Chester W. Olcott, son of former governor Ben W. Olcott of Portland, has been liberated from Zentsu prison camp on Shikoku, one of the four main Japanese islands, the Red Cross said this week.

Olcott was captured on Wake Island in December, 1941. He was a former student at Lincoln high school in Portland, and at Stanford University. Later he was associated with the United States National bank in Portland and

with an automobile concern in Lebanon.

In the message received by his father, Olcott said he was leaving for Pearl Harbor and that he was feeling great.

Two other brothers, S/Sgt. Richard H. Olcott and Cpl. Gordon Olcott are in the army.
