Stock Market May Stumble

NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (AP)—The stock market today acted tired and looked as though it would stumble for the first time in ten successive sessions, but a last-minute rally of the rails saved the trend situation.

Buyers turned to the carriers in the final hour because of the belief this group was due to catch up with the industrials which had been climbing to eight-year highs.

Shipments Up Grain Market

CHICAGO, Sept. 13 (AP)—Wheat futures advanced about a cent a bushel today as traders became more certain this country will ship large amounts of the grain to Europe.

Other grains were firm with wheat except the nearby rye contracts, which were independently weak due to delivery of 150,000 bushels of rye today on the September contract.

Traders had a report that the government would ship 30,000-40,000 bushels of wheat to Europe monthly for six months. The department of agriculture did not confirm this entirely.

Wheat closed 3/4 to 1/2 higher than the previous finish, September \$1.67 1/2, the highest since early August; corn was up 3/4 to 1/2, December \$1.16, oats were 1/4 to 1/2 higher, September 61 1/4, rye was 1/2 higher to 3/4 cents lower, September \$1.51 1/4-\$1.51, and barley was unchanged to 1 cent up, September \$1.11 1/4.
