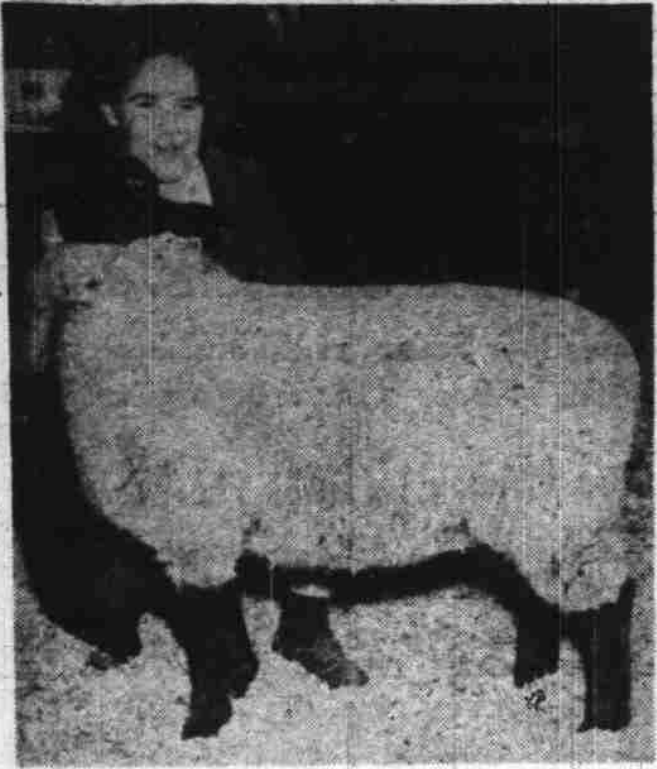


Tops At Linn-Benton 4-H Livestock Auction
