## Young Mother Excused From School Work

A 17-year-old mother of a small child could be excused from attending school, though she has not finished high school, Attorney General George Neuner has ruled and so notified the state department of education.

The law, as amended early this year by the legislature, provides that "all children between the ages of 16 and 18 years must be in school or legally employed. If

Neuner points out that the fact that the girl is married takes her out of the class of minors, but that the law does not refer to minority or majority but to age alone. However, the ruling quotes another statute to the effect that the school board of her district has authority to excuse her from compulsory school attendance, if she has completed the first eight grades, provided the board believes further attendance in school would cause hardship in her family.
