## Officer Speaks To Hollywood Lions Clubmen

Lt. Col. Earl Bradfield, who spent the past five years with the judge advocate department of the army, spoke to the Hollywood Lions club Wednesday noon about the methods of administering discipline in the army.

Colonel Bradfield said that all discipline must start in the squad, and is best explained as the "esprit de corps." Rulings of all types come from the articles of war which are statutes enacted by congress, under the authority of the constitution.

There are 121 articles, he added, the 121st being perhaps more important to the soldier than any of the others as it provides that he may, if he feels that he is not properly treated, write to his commanding general, who must forward it to the secretary of war.

These letters, he said, are all very seriously considered.

In outlining the many steps taken in official procedure he showed that every precaution is used to safeguard the accused from false and prejudiced evidence, while making sure that proper discipline is maintained.

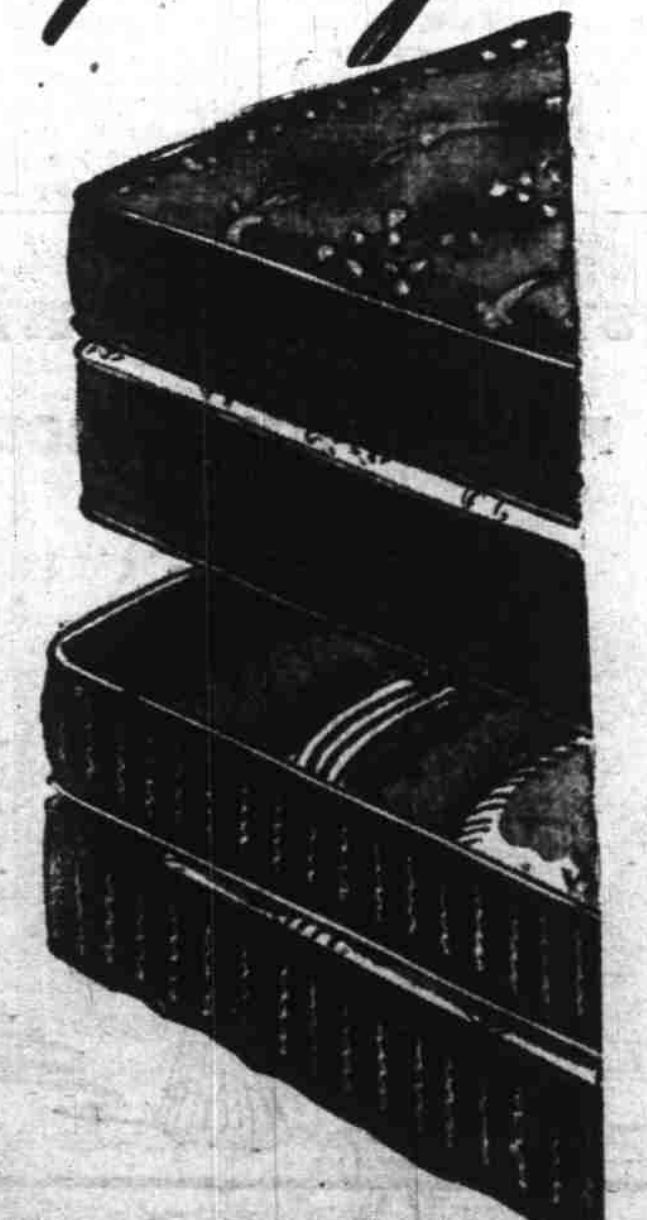
