Grain Futures Nervous With Trend Upward

CHICAGO, Oct. 5.—(AP)—Grain futures were nervous today and although the trend was upward fractionally most of the time, prices slipped occasionally and closed off slightly. Hedge selling and profit-taking were principal factors preventing wheat from marching upward as it did yesterday, when it climbed as much as 4 cents a bushel. Mills and elevator interests were buyers.

Stimulating oats buying part of the time was another 1 cent raise in the Canadian export tax, boosting the total tax to 23 cents a bushel. Wheat closed 1/4 higher to 1/2 lower than the previous finish, December 1.75 1/4-1/4; corn was 1/4 off to 1/4 up, December 1.16 1/2; oats were 1/4 higher to 1/2 lower, December 65 1/2-1/2; rye was unchanged to 1/4 down, December 1.53 1/4-1/4, and barley was unchanged to 1/4 lower, December 1.16 1/4.

In the cash market, No. 2 red winter wheat was quoted at the \$1.79 ceiling, but no sales were reported. Cash corn also held at the ceiling price. The Modern Miller, trade publication, said the quality of spring wheat in the fields in the Dakotas was deteriorating because of wet weather.

Stock Market Monopolized By Specialties

NEW YORK, Oct. 5.—(AP)—Specialties with good, peace-time prospects continued to monopolize most of the bidding in today's stock market while many leaders suffered more from neglect than real selling pressure.

Transfers of 1,420,000 shares compared with 1,340,000 Thursday. At 1945 peaks were Pepsi-Cola, up 3 1/2 on the day's heaviest volume as the outlook for sugar supplies brightened; Low's and R-K-O, in reflection of bigger box office receipts; National Power & Light, and Schenley.

The somewhat murky labor situation remained as a cautionary influence for investment contingents, as did the thought of a further technical correction.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up .3 of a point at 71.6, equalling its peak since April, 1937. The utility average advanced one-tenth of a point to a top since March 11, 1937.

Hop Markets Remain Firm

PORTLAND, Oct. 5.—(AP)—Hop markets remained firm last week despite lack of trading, the US department of agriculture reported today. Hop baling in Oregon was three-fourths completed with quality somewhat irregular, especially on late pickings. Shipments moved eastward as fast as grade certificates came in from laboratories.

With almost all hops contracted for before harvest, little trading occurred and prices held at established ceilings and discounts. Demand for future crops was slow.
