# Established in Grain Market

CHICAGO, Oct. 8 -(AP)- New seasonal peaks were established in all grain futures pits today on general buying which boosted prices around 2 cents a bushel in some cases.

Traders said more investment buying appeared today on such bullish influences as a belief that congress might enact the Page bill which would boost parity prices substantially, forecasts for frost in parts of the corn belt, and good demand for cash grain.

Deliveries making new highs for the season included May, July and September wheat and rye, July corn, July and September oats, and all deliveries of barley. December corn at one time sold at the ceiling of \$1.191/2 a bushel. Wheat closed % to 1% cent higher than the previous finish, December \$1.761/2; corn was 3/4 to 11/2 up, December \$1.18-1.181/8; oats were 11/2 to 2 cents higher. December 6634-58; rye was up 1/4 to 2 cents, December \$1.54%-1.54, and barley was 1% to 3% cents higher, December \$1.1814.


