

### Stan Hack's 12th Inning Hit Gives Cubs 8-7 Win in Series

Hostetler fell flat on his face between third base and home in the seventh inning, and was tagged out, helping break up a two-run Tiger rally.

In the eighth, when the Bengals scored four more, the fact that Eddie Mayo tried to stretch a very ordinary single into a double and was thrown out, deprived Detroit of what would have been the winning run, as Greenberg followed shortly after with his towering home run over the left field wall, his second four-baser of the series.

Had Hostetler, a veteran utility man who had begged Manager Steve O'Neill of the Tigers for a chance to appear in the series, stayed on his feet, or had Mayo been less quick on the trigger, then Greenberg's clout would have made him the hero of the series. It was that close between hero and goat for the big man.

The official scorers based their decision on Hank's culpability on the fact that he was charging in on Hack's hit when he should have been squating down some yards farther back and playing it safe. Both Roy Cullenbine and Roger Cramer, Hank's outfield teammates, said the ball simply took a crazy hop over his shoulder after it had struck a pebble.

Whatever happened, Hack deserved credit for making it possible. With one out in the fateful frame, Frank Secory had batted for Len Merullo and cracked a single. Schuster was sent in to run for him. Trout then fanned Borowy for the second out, bringing up Hack. The third baseman in six previous times up in the game had made three hits and walked twice, so he scarcely was due to deliver again.

But the veteran probably was feeling extra-determined, for he had committed glaring errors both in the seventh and eighth innings that contributed importantly to the Tigers' six runs in those chapters. At any rate, he took a firm stance and belted one of Trout's best offerings cleanly out onto the grass for his 11th hit of the series, and there went the ball game.

The Southern Pacific company is placing orders for approximately \$9,000,000 worth of new steel rail and rail fittings for use next year, enough for re-laying 725 miles of track, President A. T. Mercier announced Monday.

The new rail alone will total 138,000 gross tons, all for heavy duty and weighing either 113 or 132 pounds per yard. The new installations will replace rail that has been carrying record breaking war traffic on main tracks in territory extending from New Orleans to Los Angeles, San Francisco, Portland, Ogden.
