Canada Takes Over Meat-Packing Plants

OTTAWA, Oct. 12.—(AP)—The government today took control of five strike - threatened meat packing plants in western Canada in order to assure a steady flow of meat to hungry Europe.

Workers at the five plants, located at Vancouver, Edmonton, Regina, Prince Albert and Winnipeg, were preparing to strike Monday after an impasse in negotiations for a 30 per cent wage increase.

The plants, all operated by Burns and company, employ about 12,000 workers.

PORTLAND, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Repairs of the fish ladder over the Willamette river falls at Oregon City were completed today, at a cost of \$5000. The fall migration of silverside salmon toward the Tualatin river is expected within a week or two.

Seek Control Oriental Moth Is State Plan

A three-point program to combat the Oriental fruit moth, found in Oregon for the first time in Malheur county, was drawn up by a fruit industry advisory committee which met this week at Salem with officials of the state department of agriculture and the state college experiment station.

The committee requested the department and experiment station proceed immediately to develop a program for surveys over the state to check growing areas to determine whether moth is present; seeks to determine how to combat this pest in any area it may appear; recommended budget for research and survey.

The advisory committee was appointed last month after a series of meetings held in fruit growing districts by the department and the state college.

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The committee recommended the college work out a cooperative program with other states in a research program and the rearing of parasites to control the pest; and revocation of the Oregon quarantine against the Oriental moth because it has been found in all states bordering Oregon, as well as in Oregon, thus indicating the quarantine is no longer an effective preventive measure.

The Oriental fruit moth is a pest that came into this country more than 30 years ago and has now spread to most of the states. It effects deciduous trees, primarily commercial peach orchards.

The moth inflicts damage in two ways, as a twig borer in destroying new shoots and as a worm in ripe fruit.

BAKED EGGPLANT SLICES
1 medium sized eggplant
¼ cup finely chopped nuts
1 cup fine bread crumbs
Salt and pepper
¼ teaspoon thyme
Milk

Wash eggplant and cut in thick slices, leaving the skin on. Combine the nuts and bread crumbs. Roll the eggplant slices in the mixture and place them in a greased casserole. Sprinkle the top with salt, pepper and thyme. Add enough milk to just cover the eggplant and bake at 350 degrees until tender and brown on top.
