Bronze Star Awarded to PFC Carson

WITH THE 37th INFANTRY DIVISION ON LUZON—For "heroic achievement" in action on Luzon the bronze star medal has been awarded to PFC James "Woody" Carson, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. Claude L. Carson, 640 S. Summer st., Salem, Ore.

When his battalion suffered severe casualties near Fort Stotsenburg, Luzon, Carson volunteered to serve as a litter bearer and made four trips to the front line under heavy Jap fire to evacuate the wounded.

Carson, a veteran of 25 months overseas, will soon be on his way to the states with the returning 37th "Buckeye" division.

PFC George Worley Dues Home From Guam

PFC George W. Worley, husband of Mrs. Ruth Worley, route one, box 342E, is among Oregon men who have left the 315th bomb wing, Guam, for the United States.

Worley will be discharged from the air force upon his arrival in this country.

U. S. NAVAL HOSPITAL, Pearl Harbor, T. H. — The guns are silent but the job of caring for casualties of the Pacific war must go on in naval hospitals like this one. William Richards, pharmacist's mate 1/c, USNR, is one of the men helping at this vital job. His wife, Mrs. Gladys L. Richards, resides at Mill City, Ore. Richards was employed by Mill City Planing and Processing company before entering the navy in March, 1942. He participated in the invasions of Attu, Kiska, Anguar, and Peliu islands and holds the Asiatic-Pacific, European, American theatre and good conduct ribbons.

Eugene M. Jarvis, radioman, 2/c, 1930 Fairground rd., Salem, was on board a Pacific fleet destroyer, the Bradford, when she dropped anchor in Kagoshima Wan, Kyushu, near the Jap naval airfield of Kanoya, to accept surrender and to occupy the area. Kanoya airfield was the home port of many of the kamikazes that caused much damage at Okinawa. The Bradford, on the picket line there, took part in engagements of Tarawa, Kavieng, the Marshalls, Truk, the Marianas, Hollandia, Marcus, Saipan, Iwo Jima and Okinawa.

WITH A LANDING CRAFT FLOTILLA, Palau Islands—(Delayed)—Clifford Earl Shafer, motor machinist's mate, third class, route 1, Hubbard, Ore., served aboard an LCI (L) in the final days of the Pacific war, patrolling the waters of the Carolines to blockade the remaining Jap garrisons. The flotilla received a "well done" from its commodore, Cdr. M. B. Brown, USN, of Fargo, N. D. Some of the flotilla's ships have been assigned occupational duties, now that the Jap garrisons have surrendered.

DALLAS — Sgt. Francis Harvey, son of Mr. and Mrs. Reuben Harvey, has received his discharge after 32 months of service with the 15th air force, in Italy and Porto Rico.

Snyder Given 'Potato Plan'

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Reconversion director John W. Snyder has under consideration a "practical use program" for the nation's surplus white potatoes.

It was presented today by five senators and three congressmen who told Snyder they represented 82 members of congress in 22 states seeking to save and utilize the second largest white potato crop in history.

The group advocated dehydration for food; purchases by UN-

RRA for relief; conversion for starch, glucose and alcohol; new and seed potatoes for France and north Africa, and dehydration for aid to the Chinese.

They urged that the dehydration industry deserved an opportunity to taper off its operations and close down or adjust to a new sales program.

Warren Widden Dies At Silverton Hospital

SILVERTON — Warren Widden, 77, died at a Silverton hospital Friday following a long illness.

Born in St. Cloud, Minn., September 7, 1868, he came to Marion county nine years ago and had since resided in the Silverton and Scotts Mills districts.

Hi-Y Conclave To Hear Riggs

Following the Hi-Y conference Dr. Riggs will leave for Klamath Falls to make a formal report Monday on the recreation facilities and program of that city at a public meeting. Data for the report, requested by a joint YMCA-YWCA committee, was gathered by Dr. Riggs with the cooperation of the high school and chamber of commerce during a two week survey he conducted in the southern Oregon city in September.
