





CHICAGO, Oct. 13 -(AP)- New seasonal highs were established in wheat hit a new 20-year peak on general buying and lack of offerings due to the government wheat purchasing program.

Rye climbed more than 3 cents bushel, oats more than a cent, and wheat and corn advanced fractionally.

The government renewed its wheat buying for export this week and took at least 2,655,000 bushels in two days. Purchases Thursday, the last market day, totaled 900,000 bushels. This included 750,000 bushels of No. 1 soft red winter wheat at Chicago at \$1.90% basis delivered at Philadelphia for export. This was more than 10 cents over the ceiling and included freight costs. Wheat closed 1/4 to 1/2 higher than the previous finish, December \$1.7814, after hitting a 20year peak of \$1.78%; corn was unchanged to 1/4 up, December \$1.181/2, the ceiling; oats were ahead 1 to 15% cent, December 69; rye was 214 to 3% cents higher, December \$1.601/4-1/2, and barley was up 1/4 to 3/4, December \$1.191/2.
