### Army's Latest Jet-Propelled Plane Unveiled

BUFFALO, N.Y., Oct. 16-(AP)-The army air forces has unveiled its newest high-speed, long-range jet propelled fighter plane, the experimental XP-83, Bell Aircraft corporation, builder of the plane, announced tonight. The new plane, being shown at

the AAF's "open house" exhibition at Wright field, Dayton, Ohio, is the only fighter yet announced which is powered by two of the new General Electric I-40 jet engines, a Bell statement said. Absence of propellers enables the plane to carry a sizeable combination of machine guns and cannon. It also can carry bombs

under each wing. The plane's cockpit is located considerably forward of the wings and is equipped with bubble canopy, thus affording the pilot a high degree of visibility, Bell said."
