Huskies Hold Bevos At Bay, Score Twice for 13-0 Win

rook back recently from the wars, to boot out from the 14 on fourth down. Dick Given, one of many, many Husky backfield swiftness today, hauled the kick down on the OSC 48 and returned it to the 33. Seven plays later the Huskies scored—ripped gaping holes in the Beaver wall, big Norm Sansregret, freshman from Bellingham, coming in just in time to churn over his left tackle, twist out of the clutches of Beaver tacklers on the three and fall into the end zone. He started from the seven after "T" trots of 10, 6 and 5 yards by Given had set it up.

Freshman Wally Dash came in to try the conversion but his place kick was wide.

The Huskies came right back midway through the period and looked as if they were to do it again. As it turned out, however, the half-time buzzer sounded with OSC in possession of the ball on the Husky 22 after the day's one grand lalalooping play. Here's how it went: Karamanos got off a great kick from his 28 to Johnny Norton on the Washington 17. Norton, not even listed in the program but a hippety-hopping ball totter of the Jimmy Phelan regime at Washington and just out of the service last week; brought it back to the Washington 28. Oregon State was offside on the first play and then the Huskies began to move with their lightning-like "T". Norton, Sansregret and Given took turns galloping through the Beaver forwards and in 11 plays were on the Beaver 15, first and 10 to go.

Given hit right tackle for two and Sansregret, from one of the few Washington single wing plays, made two more. Given for one and then Sansregret again, this time for five and a first down on the four.

Only 1:10 left when Sansregret fumbled and recovered for a loss of three to the seven. Given got it back to the four and then, hoping to stop the clock, Washington substituted for a place kick. A

five yard penalty for this. Dash followed with his try from the nine, but the Beaver right side broke through to partially block it and the ball rolled to the OSC 8. Karamanos, like a flash, scooped it up and tore for the Washington end zone 92 yards away as only seconds now remained.

He picked up a blocker, Bill Austin, Woodburn's Duration league mightily last season, near midfield. But Dash, who had tried the field try was picked up also. Down the sidelines went the three—Karamanos in front, Dash next and closing in stride, for stride, and Austin but a step behind Dash. Austin couldn't throw a block—if he had it would have been clipping pure and simple. He must have realized that for he didn't try the block which if legal would have meant a sure 6 points for Oregon State. As it turned out, the much faster Dash finally caught Karamanos from the rear on the 22 and hauled him down just as the half time ran out.

It was a spine-tingler all the way and had all 22,613 off their seats. Had Karamanos been a step faster or had Austin been able to pull up close enough to ram Dash off his feet, or even off stride, the Beavers would have at least tied the ball game right there.

That was as close to the Washington end zone as the Beavers got all day. In fact the entire second half was played mostly in OSC yard, and only booming kicks by Karamanos and Dick Gray kept the Huskies at bay.

Washington had booming boots by Hemstad and Norton to throw right back at the Beavers, however, and the entire third quarter was played between the danger lines.

A fur-lined break came Washington's way in the fourth frame early when Karamanos, now spearheading with Gray a be-lated OSC passing attack, was swarmed over and fumbled while trying to toss one from his 14. The hard-charging Huskies, harrassing the Beaver backs all afternoon, didn't give the Beaver a chance to

cepted a pass to give Oregon the ball in midfield, sparked the drive with a 24-yard run, and sent a 17-yard pass to Bill Abbey for a counter.

Late in the third quarter Washington State opened an 80-yard offensive, climaxed with Lippincott scoring from the 12 yard line, just 12 seconds after the fourth quarter opened. Chuck Eckert scored from the six for the Cougars' second touchdown, after six plays, and Perrault passed to Anderson for the extra point.

Washington State scoring: touch-downs, Lippincott, Eckert. Points after touchdown, Anderson (pass from Perrault). Oregon scoring: touch-downs, Donovan, Leitch, Anderson (pass from Leitch), Abbey (pass from Reynolds). Points after touchdown, Leitch, Kaufman (place kicks).

Four plays later after Gray had made a dazzling, twisting gallop for 17 yards on one of Lon Steiner's end run options, Garth Rouse tossed a pass smack into the arms of Hungar on the 40 and he rambled it back to the Beaver 30. Down went the Huskies and their "T" again, this time to the two. But again the Beavers held and took over on the four.

Right here it should be said that the lad who was doing most of this goal line standing with terrific tackles, one right after another, was Woodburn's Austin. To say that blond Bill made three-fifths of the OSC tackles today, and more than once laid cold a Husky toter, isn't stretching things even a little. Austin as a Beaver defense man was, to put it briefly, terrific all day.

There was only little over a minute left as the Beavers tried to break loose from deep in their own yard, but the Huskies were up to keeping them there. Hartmann was thrown for three to the one. Dangerously close to a safety, and Karamanos was held at the same spot on the next play. Gray finally and reluctantly kicked out on fourth down to the 40; Norton returning it to the 26, and with 40 seconds left the Huskies set up their second touchdown. Norton on a cutback from a "T" play made 13 to the 13, and then Hungar bounced around his left end, shook off three Beaver tacklers after being halted momentarily on the five and went over standing up with time enough left for an ensuing kickoff after Dash had made good with the conversion boot.

The Beavers with their 251 yards on scrimmage and pass plays almost kept up with the 278 garnered by Washington (only eight of which came on passes), but actually the Huskies had the States making all of that yardage in OSC territory. In fact, were it not for that spectacular scramble by Karamanos in the second quarter, the Beavers would have wound up the day by playing no further in Husky territory than the 48 yard line, two steps from midfield. Dame misfortune had somewhat of a whammy on the Stinermen also. Dynamic Bob Stevens, the man who led the way against Oregon last week, wasn't even in suit today—his siege of the flu kept him at home. Bob Reiman, Corvallis' rugged right half who was also a ballplayer against Oregon, was hurt early in the game and had to retire for the day, and Reuse, also injured early, saw only part time action. Three first string backfielders on the bench is tough to take.
