

# Gilmer Home With Discharge After 3 1/2 Years

After 3 1/2 years overseas service with the army air corps, T. Sgt. Emmet Lloyd Gilmer returned to the United States Thursday aboard the USS General Aultman, docking at Portland, and at Friday received his discharge at Ft. Lewis. Gilmer makes his home with a brother on Beach avenue.

Gilmer, who wears four battle stars, the Good Conduct medal and a citation for meritorious service in the invasion of Saipan, was with the 73rd fighter squadron of the 318th fighter group of the Seventh army air force from the time of its organization in Hawaii.

This group for some time was the only one in the Marianas. With it, Gilmer landed at Saipan three days after the invasion, and as a member of the ground crew with the marines fought to hold the air field there. When the enemy had finally been driven from the field, Gilmer's outfit lengthened the air strips so that the field could be used by the Americans; then, because of the worn-out condition of their planes, the group borrowed planes which they flew from the Saipan base.

The sergeant received special recognition for this job. In April of the year, the 318th group was moved to Iwo Jima and planes helped bomb Tokyo.

During the last part of Gilmer's stay overseas he was housed in a tent which had a floor, a novelty after being in the mud for a long time. The men occasionally received shipments of fresh meat during that period, too.

Reitz is a graduate of Oregon State.

**SANTA ANA, CALIF.**—Lt. Col. Charles F. Craig, 1285 N. Cottage st., Salem, Ore., has been honorably discharged from the separation base maintained here by the army air forces. Craig is a veteran of 55 months of service in the army air forces. He served in India as B-24 pilot with the 10th air force, flying 26 bombing missions.

The AAF awarded him the distinguished flying cross, the air medal with one cluster, and the Asiatic Pacific theater ribbon with three battle stars.
