# Bound Upward

CHICAGO, Nov. 9 - (AP) - Grain futures kept on bounding upward today, with December rye at one time selling higher than wheat and the December wheat delivery hitting the \$1.801/2 a bushel ceiling for the first time.

Rye was up more than 4 cents beef. Dairy cows, heifers, bulls, veal. Fat hogs, sows, stags, boars. Market bushel at times and wheat and price. E. C. McCandlish, rt. 5, box 373. Ph. 8147, across from ball park, S. 25th a bushel at times and wheat and oats more than 2 cents. December rye reached \$1.82%, the first time in more than 20 years that rye has brought a higher price than wheat. Profit-taking caused reactions.

Wheat closed 1/4 to 13/4 cents higher than the previous finish, December \$1.80%; corn -was-unchanged at ceilings of \$1.181/2; oats were ahead 14 to 1% cents, December 73%-%; rye was unchanged to 21/2 cents higher, December \$1.80-\$1.80%, and barley was % off to ½ up, December \$1.20%.

Numerous other bullish influences have affected prices in recent sessions. These included cash and mill demand for wheat.
