Grass Urged As Cover for Burned Area

ROSEBURG, Ore., Nov. 9 (AP)—The Douglas county agricultural agent's suggestion that areas creating a forest fire hazard be planted with fescue grass, drew particular interest at a special state forestry committee hearing today.

The agent, J. Roland Parker, said experiments with the species—which stays green all summer—had been successful in Douglas county fire and logged out sectors. The grass effectively controls undergrowth, he explained. Parker also urged that wide fire breaks be constructed.

Judge H. D. Kerkman, Hillsboro, committee chairman, said many constructive ideas to improve Oregon's system of forest fire prevention and suppression were gained at today's meeting and yesterday's in Eugene. Representatives of federal and state forest protective agencies, timber owners, logging mill operators, grange and agriculture representatives took part.

New Peaks in Stock Market

NEW YORK, Nov. 9 (AP)—Buyers shifted to utilities and specialties in today's stock market, pushing these to peaks for nearly nine years with gains of fractions to more than three points, while many industrial leaders were thrown for further losses.

The power group, which will benefit substantially from elimination of excess profits taxes, was buoyed partly by the president's signing of the revenue measure. Sugars exhibited strength as the tight supply situation in this field aroused hopes of increased prices. Steels and motors still were depressed by labor controversies. Rails generally stumbled over profit cashing.

Transfers tapered to 1,830,000 shares from 1,960,000 Thursday. The Associated Press 80-stock average was unchanged at 74.7 of 1002 issues registering, against 1023 the day before, 418 advanced and 373 declined.

Grain Futures Bound Upward

CHICAGO, Nov. 9 (AP)—Grain futures kept on bounding upward today, with December rye at one time selling higher than wheat and the December wheat delivery hitting the \$1.80 1/2 a bushel ceiling for the first time.

Rye was up more than 4 cents a bushel at times and wheat and oats more than 2 cents. December rye reached \$1.82 1/2, the first time in more than 20 years that rye has brought a higher price than wheat. Profit-taking caused reactions.

Wheat closed 1/4 to 1 1/2 cents higher than the previous finish, December \$1.80 1/2; corn was unchanged at 1 1/2 1/2; oats were ahead 1/4 to 1 1/2 cents, December 73 1/2-74; rye was unchanged to 2 1/2 cents higher, December \$1.80-\$1.80 1/2, and barley was 1/2 off to 1/4 up, December \$1.20 1/2.

Numerous other bullish influences have affected prices in recent sessions. These included cash and mill demand for wheat.
