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dog back. With fourth down on Silverton's four yard line, Quarterback Arnold Bigler flipped a flat pass intended for End Foy Harper. Silverton's Dick Beyer speared it on the two-yard line, however, and outtraced the field 98 yards to score. Fullback Herigstad followed up by plunging across for the conversion.

Following the halftime intermission the Bulldogs fired up for two quick third period touchdowns. Led by their brilliant Al Zuber and Bigler, the Bulldogs drove 63 yards for the first, Bigler scoring it on a naked reverse around Silverton's right end for 10 yards. Zuber trailed to Harper for the conversion and 7-7.

Another Woodburn drive for 54 yards paid off when Zuber, on a delayed thrust at his left tackle, charged 10 yards and into the end zone. Bigler's attempted pass for point was batted down, however.

The Foxes had a fourth period drive of their own to finally tie it again. With sub halfback Darrell Johnson doing the rambling mostly, the Foxes went 66 yards in 11 plays, Johnson going the final eight. Dale Bennett tried to crash over center for the winning conversion point, but was held inches short.

The closeness of the game is exhibited by the statistics. Woodburn had 104 net yards gained and 12 first downs to Silverton's 90 and 10.

The No. 1 factor rising up to bring about the tie for Silverton was her big line. Outside the third quarter yielding to Woodburn for the two touchdowns, the Silver Fox forwards halted Zuber and company time after time. Early game penalties kayced two Woodburn threats also. Woodburn had a cinch touchdown in the opening frame on a Zuber pass, but the receiver, standing on the goal line, dropped the toss.

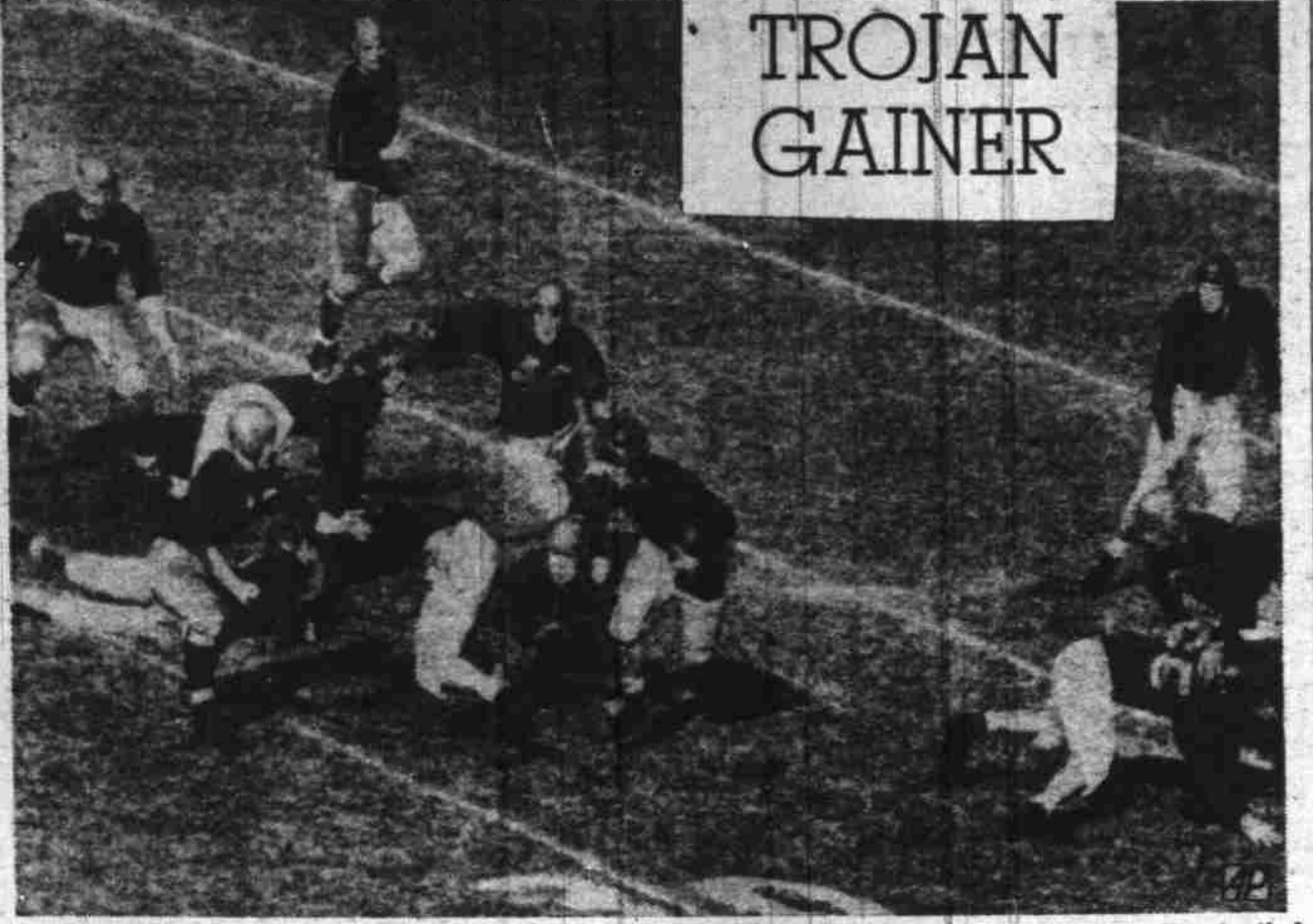
The two teams play again at Woodburn November 30.

59 yards and a touchdown, and was never in the running thereafter.

The Bob Metzger coached Pioneers simply had too much brawn and power for the Leslies, Osborn and Frank Garland leading the way with the crunching over the Missionary tackles and guards consistently for long gains. Osborn carried over all four of the winners' scores and two of the three conversions to ring up 28 of the Parrish points.

The second Pioneer score came near the end of the first period after end Bob Meaney had recovered Jim Moore's fumble on the Leslie 30. Osborn, Garland and Bruce Barker took turns lugging the ball, with Osborn knifing over from the five on the fifth play. He added the conversion to make it 14-0 at the end of the quarter.

Leslie fought back in the second stanza, holding her opponents even-up and almost connected for a quick score when center Ray Cummings, the outstanding line-man on either team all afternoon, intercepted a pass and galloped 51 yards before he was overhauled on the Parrish 29.

A poor Leslie punt, which travelled only 15 yards to the Missionary 25, set up the third Parrish score in the opening moments of the third quarter. Osborn accounted for 30 of the 25 yards on that spurge, carrying over eventually from the two. Bruce Barker converted to make it 21 to 0.

Leslie finally caught fire after that score and came back with her biggest effort. Fullback Dean Bunnell returned the kickoff 25 yards to mid-field. Switching from their customary single-wing plays to an intricate "V" formation, the Missionaries pounded for four straight first downs to the four yard line. Three plays through the middle carried to the three-inch marker. But a quarterback
