Fifteen thousand persons died of typhus, but prison doctors were forbidden to report an epidemic because officials "didn't want a quarantine."

Naked prisoners were made to stand in line in front of the hospital for hours, in all kinds of weather, while doctors examined them to see if they were able to work. This lineup was called the "slave market."
