

Nut Growers Reorganize as No-Profit Unit

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 29 (AP)—Reorganization of the Western Nut Growers association to incorporate as the Nut Growers Society of Oregon and Washington, a non-profit group, was approved at the 31st annual meeting today.

R. A. Duncan, Portland, was elected president of the Oregon board of trustees; A. R. Quackenbush, Eugene, was elected Oregon vice-president and Harold Quick, Chehalis, to the same office for the Washington group.

Probable reason for the recent decline in fibert crops is faulty nutrition in orchards, C. E. Schuster, U.S. department of agriculture horticulturist, and Arthur S. King, extension specialist from Oregon State college, agreed.

Schuster speculated that the poor crops might be due to a growth cycle which would appear regularly.

King urged more cover crops to restore nutrients to the soil and also recommended shallow cultivation.

A Portland orchardist, E. W. Woodford, suggested growers thin their trees. He said that thinning part of his orchard 50 per cent had resulted in a 15 1/2 per cent yield increase.

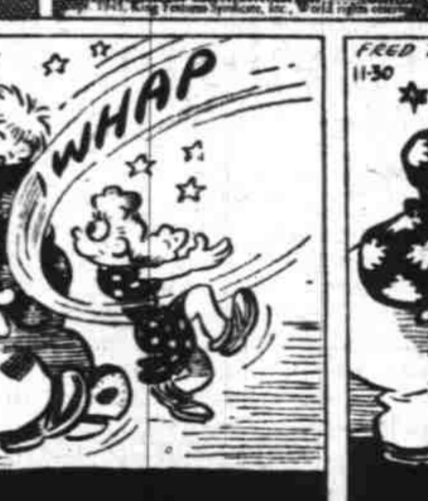
