December 7, Pearl Harbor day, the chapter is having initiation of new members.

Membership in the Disabled American Veterans is open to any veteran who has been wounded or disabled in active service, overseas or in this country.

The DAV is chartered by congress as the official voice of the nation's wartime disabled. It was formed in 1920, following World War I, and today its membership is composed of one-half membership World-War 2 disabled.

"Perhaps," said Tugman, "people can make their best contribution to world order by solving the local problems with which they are familiar."
