

Chicago Man Named to Head Dental School

PORTLAND, Dec. 11—(P)—The state board of higher education today named Dr. Harold J. Noyes, 47, Chicago, dean of the University of Oregon Dental school in Portland at \$8,500 a year.

Dr. Noyes now is a department head at Northwestern university dental school.

The board authorized a program to make surplus housing from the Vancouver area available by fall, 1944, for 500 student veterans each at the state college and university.

Bids will be opened January 22 for a new women's dormitory at Oregon State, the cost covered by a self-liquidating bond issue. The board also approved preliminary plans for a new naval science building at the college for ROTC work.

Corvallis airport facilities will be used for a flight training program at OSC, under college control but with instruction contracted to a private firm. The new turkey research project by the agricultural experiment station will be launched on a \$5,200 budget, it was decided.

A special committee reported equipment at the college engineering school "utterly inadequate" and said the same condition was found in other schools on both campuses. Special appropriations will be sought from the legislature by "repeated requests," it was stated.

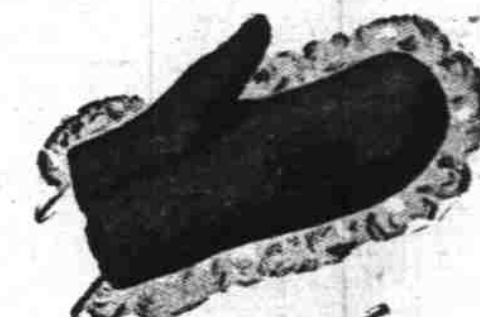
