## Valley Obituaries

**Glenn Elkins**

**ALBANY** — Glenn Elkins died of a heart attack in Eugene Sunday. Elkins was born in Dallas but came to Albany when a boy and lived here for many years.

In 1913 he married Edith Hackleman of Albany. Elkins was a veteran of World War I and was a member of the famous 411th telegraph battalion. For the past 30 years he had been an employee of the Pacific Telephone company. He was a member of the Methodist church and of the Masonic lodge.

Survivors are the widow, the former Edith Hackleman; son, William D. Elkins; his aged father, William D. Elkins, sr., 92, who made his home with his son, Glenn; two brothers, the Rev. W. A. Elkins of Monmouth and Clarence A. Elkins of Eugene; and one grandson. Funeral services were held Wednesday in Eugene.

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
