

Rev. Marion G. Griebenow, 24 Years in Tibet Mission, 'Mighty Glad to Be in Salem'

"Mighty glad to be back in Salem" today was the Rev. Marion G. Griebenow, former resident of this city and brother of Paul Griebenow of 160 Fairview, who came by horseback, plane and ship from Labrang, Tibet, where he was on missionary service for the Christian & Missionary Alliance church.

The tall, graying pastor, who first went to Tibet 24 years ago and is now on his third leave of absence, last was in Salem in March of 1937. He still carries a 1937 Oregon driver's license and a check book on the Ladd & Bush bank.

San New in Germany
The Rev. M. Griebenow laid plans to return home soon after the war ended. His wife and two children, a boy 14 and a girl 6, arrived in New York last August aboard the repatriation ship Gripsholm. Another son, George, is with the U. S. occupation forces in Germany.

The pastor left Labrang by horseback early in October, traveling by that method for 200 miles to Lanchow. From there the combat cargo command of the 14th air force took him to Shanghai where he boarded the troopship USS Annabelle Lykes which landed in San Francisco December 5.

Visited in San Diego
At that time the missionary did not know that his mother had moved to San Francisco, following the death in Salem in June of his father, August Griebenow. Nor did he know that his wife and children were residing with the former's sister in Wilmington, Del. But his church at Oakland, Calif., provided this information. Prior to coming to Salem on Tuesday he had visited a sister in San Diego.

The pastor said Labrang was the third largest monastic city in Tibet, with 3000 Buddhist monks. Total population is between 30,000 and 40,000. He said he had noted inflation in the United States "but nothing like in China."

Suit Cost \$67,500
The blue twist suit he wore to Salem cost \$67,500 in Chinese national currency. A pound of coffee in China cost \$10,000 (\$7.50 American money at that time), and a cup of coffee \$400.

The missionary, who will be at the 11 a.m. services Sunday at the Christian & Missionary Alliance church here at North 5th and Gaines streets, plans to remain in this country at least a year before returning to Labrang near the headwaters of the Yellow river in Tibet — "the last corner of the world into which Christianity has not penetrated."
