POW Slapping Denied by Nip Officer at Trial

YOKOHAMA, Saturday, Dec. 22-(A)-The Japanese army custom of slapping its men became part of the defense today in the war crimes trial of Tatsuo Tsuchiya, "little glass eye."

One-armed Yokichi Nishino, a former guard at Mitsuschima prison camp where Tsuchiya was alleged to have committed "brutal atrocities," said he had seen the defendant slap a prisoner with his open palm, but that this was the "customary Japanese army way" of punishing its men.

"When in the army I was struck many times for little errors," he went on. It was "customary" to use knotted ropes, clubs and rubber shoes in striking internees.

Kiyoki Matsuozki, also a former Mitsushima guard, was questioned in Japanese by a defense civilian attorney, Jiro Watanabe. The witness said there were cases of slapping, but he did not recall PFC Robert Gordon Teas, Streator, Ill., for whose death "little glass eye" is on trial.

Matsuzoki testified Tsuchiya was "very diligent," sometimes carrying food on his back 25 miles to the isolated camp innorthern Honshu.

Another defense witness, Harumi Kawate-himself a war criminal suspect-testified Tsuchiya was "always patient and fair." Not once did he see Tsuchiya




