LIU Defeats Tennessee '5

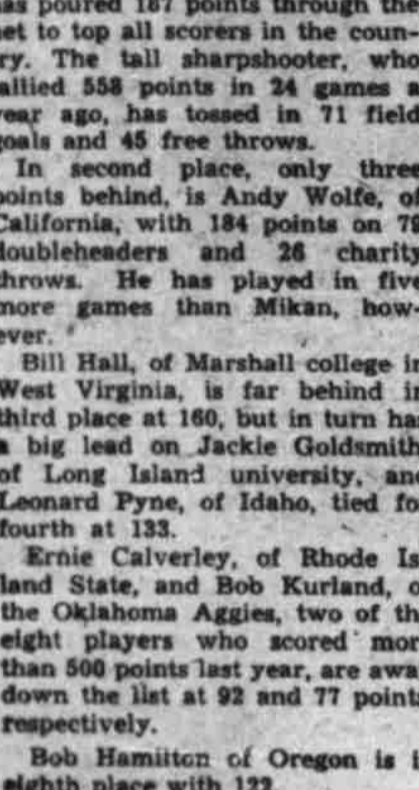

morrow but no one is taking his eyes off Forrest C. (Phog) Allen's Kansas Jawharkers.

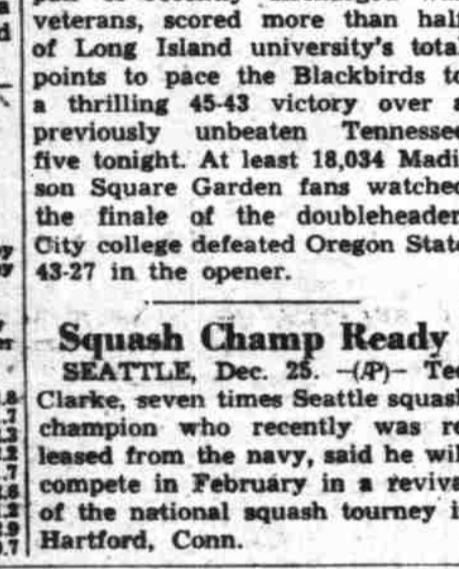
