Wheat Futures Financial - Farm - Markets - Classified

CHICAGO, Dec. 27 (AP)—New crop wheat futures prices were tilted further upward today with the July delivery reaching a new seasonal high at \$1.79 1/2 a bushel, only one cent under the ceiling. Commission houses and mills were principal buyers of the grain, bidding the prices up 3/8 cent a bushel on July and 1/8 cent on September contracts. Offerings were far below demand and mostly from local interests. Trading in the May delivery, already at the ceiling, was negligible, as cash deliveries continued scarce.

Wheat closed unchanged to 3/4 cent higher than the previous finish. May \$1.80 1/2; corn unchanged at \$1.80 1/2; oats 1/4 to 3/8 lower, May 77 1/4; rye unchanged to 3/8 lower, May \$1.74-1.74 1/2; barley unchanged to 1/8 higher, May \$1.22 1/2.

Milk Decision Time Extended
 An extension of time to January 12 for hearing objections or additional suggestions in the proposed state grades and standards for milk and cream was announced Thursday by the state department of agriculture. Deadline was originally set for December 28 but it was felt that because of the holidays this would not give all an opportunity to present views. Hearing on the standards was held in Salem December 21. The final order will be promulgated as soon as possible after January 12.

The grades and standards apply to fluid milk and cream sold in the bottle and can trade.

 NEW YORK, Dec. 27 (AP)—Stocks generally retreated without much urging in today's market although strong spots persisted among liquors and assorted specialties.

Prices dipped after a fairly active and steady opening. Recently climbing rails, mail orders, aviation, utilities and coppers registered losses of fractions to around 3 points but distillers generally finished up 1 to 6. Aided transfers totaled 1,320,000 shares compared with 1,410,000 Wednesday.

Principal blame for the day's stumble was placed on year-end selling to establish tax profits under the 25 per cent capital gains rule.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .6 of a point at 75.2.
