### Band Concert Is Friday, March 8

When the Salem high school band presents its annual winter concert March 8 they will play selections to be played in the state contest in April. The first section of the concert will be given by the contest band and features the first movement of the "Unfinished Symphony" by Schubert, and the March from the Queen of Sheba by Gounod. These selections are taken from the national contest list and are required for class A bands.

The second portion of the program will feature the 110-piece band, largest high school band in the state and one of the largest in the country. The band was chosen as the only one to appear before the Oregon State Teachers convention in Portland and to be used as a demonstration and clinic band.
