Blessing of Palms Will Mark Catholic Observance in Valley

The blessing of the palms and reading of the account of the passion in the gospel according to St. Matthew will mark Palm Sunday observance in the Catholic churches of Salem and the Willamette valley as throughout the United States and the world and the final approach to the Easter time.

The story of the passion will be read at least two masses at each of the Salem churches Sunday.

Once at the mass when the palms are blessed. At St. Vincent de Paul's it will be at the 9 a. m. mass and at St. Joseph's at 6:30 mass. The palms will be distributed to members of the congregation at that and later masses and at the Sunday evening devotions.

Four Gospels Read

The gospel of the passion will be read three times again at masses during holy week. The passion from the gospel according to St. Mark will be read Tuesday morning, Wednesday morning the story of the passion according to St. Luke, and then on Good Friday the passion story according to St. John will be read as part of the mass of the pre-sanctified.

Only one mass will be read in each church on Holy Thursday when the church observes the memorial of the institution of the sacrament of the eucharist.

Plan Three Hour Service

Following the mass at each Salem Catholic church and in most of the churches of the valley the procession will be held to the altar of repose where adoration will continue throughout the day.

The mass of the pre-sanctified will be celebrated at St. Vincent de Paul church at 8 a. m. and then in the afternoon adoration of the cross, stations starting at 2:30.

The mass of the pre-sanctified will be part of the three hour service from noon to 3 p. m. at St. Joseph's. This has been the schedule for this, one of the largest parishes outside of Portland, for several years on Good Friday.

The palms will be blessed at

the 10:30 mass at St. Luke's in Woodburn and will be distributed then and at the afternoon service at 4. Other masses will be at 7 and 8:30.
