Stock Market Soars to New 15-year Marks

NEW YORK, April 20 (AP)—Stocks broke through the February bull market peak into a 15-year high in today's market, aided by upturns in utility and copper mining shares.

The new level was attained despite softness of some rails and a number of pivotal industrials which imparted a mixed appearance to the list. Most losses were held to fractions, however, and gains ranging to more than a point were in the majority at the close.

Transfers of 770,000 shares compared with 620,000 a week ago. The week's volume of 6,429,940 shares was more than 1,000,000 below that of the preceding week.

Market Lifted By U. S. Offer To Buy Grains

CHICAGO, April 20 (AP)—Announcement of a government grain buying program to combat famine in Europe created sharp advances in active grain futures today.

The upturn was led by May rye, which advanced 5 cents, the permissible limit in one session, to a new all time high.

At the close wheat, corn and barley were unchanged at ceilings. Oats were unchanged to 2 1/2 higher, July 83, May rye finished at \$2.53 1/2, up 5 cents, while deferred rye contracts were unchanged at ceiling.

The Minneapolis, Kansas City and St. Louis grain exchanges were closed, leaving Chicago as the only domestic grain market open.

Traders said they felt the government's plan to pay a 30 cents a bushel bonus on corn and wheat should result in more country offerings of those grains. However, there was a disposition to "wait and see" in view of the lack of success in recent efforts to get farmers to ship their grain.
