

OPA Price Rise in Automobiles Predicted

WASHINGTON, May 20.—(AP)—OPA today prepared to boost new car prices again, even as the CIO United Auto Workers announced that the union has filed a formal protest against previous increases. A high OPA official who asked to remain anonymous said prices for the public pays for cars will be increased an average of four to five per cent within 10 days to offset higher costs of steel, other materials and parts.

State Employees Seek Improved Conditions

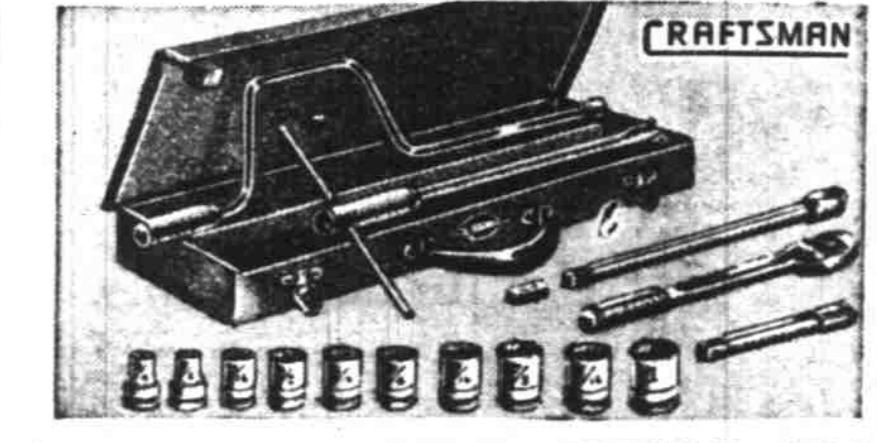
