

Barley Contest Announced for Valley Growers

Willamette valley barley growers will be interested in the brewing barley contest that will be a part of the Pacific International Livestock exposition to be held in Portland October 5 to 12.

The contest will provide a first prize of \$250 and a second prize of \$100 for the entries from the Willamette valley. There will be a class for two-row barley and a class for six-row barley. Inquiry from W. G. Nibler, Marion county agent, reveals that many acres of brewing barley have been sold from Marion county in the past few years at a premium price for growers. To be suitable for brewing purposes, Nibler says, barley must be of a certain quality to produce good malt. It is the purpose of this contest to familiarize growers with the qualities necessary for good brewing barley and to locate some superior seed lots. Growers entering this contest can afford to do considerable field work going to clean up the harvested seed, says Nibler.

Specifications for the contest are:

Each exhibitor must have at

least 20 acres and county AAA committees must certify that the entry is representative of the 20 acres or more.

Each entry must be not less than 100-pound grain sack. Exhibitors must agree to give the Great Western Malt company an option to buy his crop at the market plus suitable premium for seed. The company in turn agrees that any seed thus bought will be returned for seed to the company in which the seed was produced.

Judging will be done by representatives of the state departments of agriculture of the three states, a representative of the USDA and a representative of the state colleges of the three states. Malt barley will be judged on the following points: purity (freedom from mixtures of other kinds of barley in addition to other grains and weeds); color; freedom from foreign material; uniformity; protein value; freedom from skinned and broken kernels.

WHEAT READY BY JULY 4

PORTLAND, June 12 (AP)—The northwest's first wheat will be ready for harvest between July 4 and July 10, the Pacific Northwest Crop Improvement association said today. It will come from Franklin and Walla Walla counties in Washington, Willard N. Crawford, field secretary, said.

Loan Rates And Support Prices Named

A ladino clover support price 15 cents a pound less than for 1945 is the new provision of the 1946 hay and pasture seed loan program most important to Willamette valley producers, says E. Harvey Miller, chairman of the state PMA committee.

Under the 1946 schedule, top quality certified ladino clover seed will command a loan rate of \$1.35 compared with last year's \$1.50. More than 75,000 pounds of the 1946 crop were placed under loan by Oregon producers.

Loan rates for two other seed crops have been lowered one cent a pound to eight cents for perennial sweet clover and three cents for farm-stored sudan grass. Unchanged are alfalfa, common at 33 cents and certified at 40 cents; alsike clover, 25 cents; red clover, common at 28 cents and certified at 34 cents; certified orchard grass, 15 cents; white clover, 30 cents.

These loan rates are for seed meeting basic germination and purity requirements. Appropriate discounts are provided for seed of lower quality. With the exception of sudan grass, loans will be made only on seed stored in approved warehouses. Details can be obtained from county agricultural conservation committees.

In addition to the support prices, extra returns are offered to producers who harvest any of legume seeds for which increased production is urgently needed. Poundage payments of seven cents a pound for harvesting alfalfa and alsike clover and nine cents for red clover will be made through the 1946 agriculture conservation program funds provided by congress to stimulate greater production.

G. H. Ottaway Takes Assistant Agent Job in Clackamas

G. H. Ottaway, who has taken the job of assistant county agent in Clackamas county, tells that the newly formed Clackamas county Dairy Herd Improvement association of which Milton Corum is tester, is moving right along. During the past month, 724 cows were tested. The total average of all cows tested during the month was 695 pounds of milk and 32.5 pounds of fat per cow. Thirty-four herds were tested and 248 cows produced over 40 pounds of fat.

Herds averaging over 40 pounds of fat, including dry cows were those of Herman Staehly, who has 30 head of Guernseys, averaging 43.6 for the month; John Lienhart (formerly of Marion county) six head of Jerseys which averaged 42.1 pounds of fat; Vernon Hepler, 10 head of Jerseys, averaging 41.9 pounds of fat and Staehly Brothers, 61 head of Guernseys, which averaged 40.1.
