Seattle Reports Caterpillars' Ranks Decline

SEATTLE, June 13 (AP)—There were smiles tonight along West Dravus street as the caterpillar bluff residents of that Magnolia Bluff thoroughfare could see the ground again.

Not much ground, but there were gaps in the ranks of the black caterpillar army which surged across the street from vacant lots last week and formed a writhing carpet on lawns, sidewalks and porches.

"There are a lot of them, alive and dead, still in my yard," reported Mrs. Ann McCreery, "but the alive ones seem to be ailing. We've sprayed the place with arsenate of lead and hope we have them stopped."

She said the school board, which owned the vacant tract from which the invasion came, sent out a fleet of spray trucks and these "did a wonderful job."

Soviets Scorn Spanish Plan

NEW YORK, June 13 (AP)—The United Nations security council postponed action on the controversial Spanish case again today after Soviet Delegate Andrei A. Gromyko declared Russia would not support a new proposal to confer the case to the 51-nation general assembly.

Hoyt Flays U.S. Foreign Policy

ESTES PARK, Colo., June 13 (AP)—Palmer Hoyt, publisher of the Denver Post, declared tonight the United States "must express definite disapproval of Russia's continuing 'peaceful' conquests."

Mihailovic, U.S. Officer Met Nazis

BELGRADE, June 13 (AP)—Gen. Draja Mihailovic said today that the chief of the U. S. mission to his chetnik headquarters had advised a nazi major at a conference in September, 1944, that Germany was vanquished and the nazis in Yugoslavia should turn their arms over to Mihailovic.

Mrs. Howard Succumbs to Long Illness

Mrs. James J. Howard succumbed last evening at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. A. Schramm, 165 N. 17th st. Her illness had been of long duration but became acute a few weeks ago.

Patricia L. Schramm was born in Salem, Aug. 23, 1919, and spent her life here and in Corvallis. She graduated from Salem high school in 1937 and from Willamette university in 1941. She completed her arts course in three years and devoted her fourth year to the study of law which she planned to pursue, until a severe illness following her graduation forced her to give up advanced study.

On May 11, 1942, she was united in marriage to James J. Howard of Sandy, Ore., at San Diego, Calif., where Mr. Howard was in the military. He served through most of the war in the south Pacific returning home last September. Mr. and Mrs. Howard went to Corvallis last fall where he resumed college work at OSC. A recurrence of the illness which had beset her for five years caused her to return to the parental home here.

Mrs. Howard is survived by her husband, her parents, a sister, Susanna, rehabilitation assistant at the Fitzsimmons veterans' hospital, Denver, and a brother, Philip, at home. She was a member of the Beta Chi sorority, of Chapter AR, PEO, Corvallis, of the Mt. View Eastern Star and of the First Methodist church, Corvallis.

Last of Hesse Jewels Found

FRANKFURT, Germany, June 13 (AP)—Army authorities today announced the finding in a German hideaway of a portion of the Hesse crown jewels valued at \$40,000 to \$50,000, and said they believed the entire haul of \$1,500,000 now had been recovered.

Three officers arrested in connection with the theft of the jewels from Kronberg castle will be tried in Frankfurt.

10 Cars of Oats Due in 5 Days

SPOKANE, June 13 (AP)—Twenty more cars of oats are on the way from the Midwest to relieve the critical feed shortage in the Pacific northwest. C. P. Downen, Washington state director of the production and marketing administration, announced today.
