Gardening Today

I hope you are all remembering the fourth annual Salem Rose show which opened last night in the gymnasium of the YMCA building, Salem. It carries through today and is definitely worth seeing — even twice.

Because questions have piled so high upon my desk, and because we have so little space in papers these little Madson days, I am going to devote my whole space to answers — although I had planned to tell you of a garden I had visited recently and a number of things I had learned in doing so. But they can wait.

Questions and answers:
Mrs. J. E. B. writes that her sweetpeas are about four feet high, quite thick-foliaged in good color, but that when the bud clusters are just nicely formed they begin to turn yellow, shrivel up and fall off. She has grown sweetpeas for a number of years on the same plot of ground.

Ans.: Plan next year to plant the sweetpeas in another location. From your brief description, I would "guess" first that the peas had bud drop, a non-parasitic disease ascribed to various causes. In some cases it has been corrected by the use of artificial light and by applications of muriate of potash and acid phosphate. — all corrections almost impossible at this time. From your description of the vines, it would not appear the peas were infected with mosaic, which stunts the vines and produces few flowers. In this disease the plants should be removed and burned at once. Anthracnose affects stems, flowers and leaves with white, dead spots as the chief symptom. Here control is with the seed. Obtain seed from healthy

plants, soak for five minutes in a five per cent formaldehyde solution prior to planting, and use clean soil. Burn all refuse in the fall and pull out badly effected plants during the summer. Streak is another serious disease characterized by reddish-brown streaks along the stem, and to be controlled as suggested for anthracnose.

Mrs. D. C. sends a sample of azalea foliage affected with a fungus which causes leaves to swell into galls.

Ans.: This is becoming a common fungus in azalea plants in this area. The swollen leaves should be picked off and burned. None should be permitted to drop in the soil. Good air circulation, plenty of water during the summer, well-mulched soil all help to prevent this disease. Some growers are dusting with sulphur in late summer to keep down mildew which seems to help bring on the disease.

Mrs. F. T. sends a sample of leaf-scoured disease on azaleas. As this fungus overwinters in the fallen leaves, clean up all plant debris, and spray with copper ammonium silicate. Copper sprays or dusts will help to control most of the azalea diseases. Clean culture is also essential. Good summer culture is important in azalea growing. Rhododendrons and azaleas have grown so easily here that we have neglected good culture.

E. M. writes that last year only half of his blackberries turned black, the others remaining red and hard. His vines are looking good now and wants to know how to keep the berries ripening.

Ans.: This blackberry mite, which causes the trouble, should have been controlled earlier in the season.
