INGLEWOOD, Calif., June 18—(AP)—PFC John W. Dawson, attached to the army recruiting station, solved his housing problem today. He signed up Oscar Witherspoon, a European veteran, for a three-year hitch. Then he moved into Witherspoon's house.

DEBT LIMIT LOWERED

WASHINGTON, June 18—(AP)—Amid shouted demands for less federal spending, the house voted without a dissenting voice Monday to reduce the nation's authorized debt limit from the record \$300,000,000 wartime high to \$275,000,000.

1,000 Cars of Grain on Way To Northwest

SPOKANE, June 18—(AP)—More than 1,000 cars of northwest grain, well above the 800 cars northwest feed dealers have estimated were needed to relieve a critical Oregon - Washington poultry feed shortage, soon will be rolling into the northwest, the Washington state production and marketing administration said today.

R. B. Collins, member of the state PMA committee, said more than 80 cars of whole oats and 51 cars of gluten feed and gluten meal now are on the way to the two states.

He said PMA officials also had advised that 175 cars of commodity credit corporation oats were ready for immediate shipment from Minneapolis and that about 480 cars of feed barley and 320 cars of maling barley had been promised in the next few weeks by Washington, D.C., PMA officials.

The 80 cars of oats now in transit are part of 150-200 carloads being shipped at the rate of 10 to 15 cars a day by the Farmers Union in the midwest, Collins said.

5,000 Loggers Back at Work In Vancouver

VANCOUVER, B. C., June 18—(CP)—It is expected that 5,000 men of the 35,000 workers on strike since May 15 will return to work tomorrow at coastal and interior box factories and logging camps supplying them with necessary lumber.

Meanwhile, there was no settlement in sight of the major dispute affecting the other 30,000 workers.

At Ottawa today federal labor minister Humphrey Mitchell urged the workers to adopt the recommendations of Chief Justice Gordon Sloan who proposed a 15-cent-an-hour increase in wages, a 40-hour week and the revocable dues check-off.

The IWA now wants a government-directed referendum on a proposed union-maintenance clause.

Urges Farm Jobs For U.S. Workers

WASHINGTON, June 18—(AP)—Rep. August H. Andresen (R-Minn.) urged today that federal government workers be "put to work on our farms" for a month. "The government ought to give its 3,000,000 workers a holiday and send them out to the farms of America," he told the house.

"Most of these workers don't know a thing about the problems of the farmer. They ought to find out that they can't get milk just by turning a spigot."

Schooling for War Testified

TOKYO, Wednesday, June 19—(AP)—A Japanese professor once jailed as a pacifist told the international war crimes court today that Japanese soldiers' suicidal determination to die in combat was bred deliberately in the nation's schoolrooms.

Teachers were required to spread the doctrine or face dismissal or prison, he testified. One of the defendants, Marquis Koichi Kido, former lord keeper of the privy seal, forced the resignation of one university professor who had written about peace, Ouchi testified.

DEFEAT CONCEDED

BOSTON, June 18—(AP)—Francis D. Harriss, Boston lawyer tonight conceded the democratic nomination for governor to Gov. Maurice J. Tobin, who was running more than two to one ahead in early returns to his bid for a second term.

GOP Contest For Governor Close in East

A four-sided battle for the Michigan gubernatorial nomination narrowed down early Wednesday to a ding-dong contest between Kim Sigler, former special prosecutor for the Ingham county grand jury, and Lieut. Gov. Vernon J. Brown.

With 1,493 precincts reported of the state's 3,950, Sigler had a 61,556 to 57,398 lead. Raymond J. Kelly, former national commander of the American Legion, was third with 38,531 and Mayor Edward J. Jeffries of Detroit fourth with 20,710.

Former Governor Murray D. Van Wagner was far ahead of William J. Cody of Detroit in the democratic nomination, 25,748 to 6,152 in 1379 precincts.

Results of the top contests in the Massachusetts primary: Massachusetts governor: Democratic Gov. Maurice J. Tobin won renomination handsily over Francis D. Harrigan, Boston lawyer; republican, Lieut. Gov. Robert F. Bradford nominated as Tobin's November opponent without opposition.

McCarey Tops U.S. Incomes

WASHINGTON, June 18—(AP)—With 12-month earnings of \$1,113,035, Film Producer-director Leo McCarey led a treasury listing of 593 of the nation's top money earners for calendar 1944 and business fiscal years ended during 1945.

Horse-racing placed the number two earner, Charles H. Strub, vice president of the Los Angeles Turf club, who earned \$446,337.

Third and fourth were Film Financier Charles P. Skouras, with \$393,000, and Actor Fred MacMurray, with \$391,217.

The highest paid woman, screen Actress Carmen Miranda, was 35th with \$201,458. Charles E. Wilson, president of General Motors, got fifth place with \$362,954.
