CONN Gate Expected To Miss Mark

Odds on Louis Shaved Down: Now 1216-5

By Sid Feder NEW YORK, June 18.-(AP)-In what is easily the most ballyhooed event in sports historyand possibly the richest -- Joe Louis collides with Billy Conn in Yankee stadium tomorrow night in the toughest test of his nine-

year reign as king of the ring. Five years and one day after they met the first time, the greatest fighter of his generation takes on the Pittsburgh boxing ace at 10 p. m. (EDT) over the 15-round "derby route" in the 22nd defense of his all-time record run as head man of the nose smashing indus-

And promoter Mike Jacobs was still hopeful tonight that all previous gate receipt "highs" would be wiped out by the gold rush accompanying this first heavyweight title tussle since 1942, for which he is demanding a record \$100 for each ringside seat.

Despite the onrush of fistic faithful from virtually all over the world in such numbers they have New York jammed to the rafters, t appeared tonight, however, that the gate would just miss the record \$2.658,660 lured into Soldier Field, Chicago, by Jack Dempsey and Gene Tunney for their return match exactly 19 years ago, come Saturday.

Jacobs pointed out that It is impossible to tell the size of the pot for this one until the returns from all precincts are in, since the ticket sale covers a wide area. But the best estimates were that 65,000 fans would bulge the huge Bronx ballyard and would make Mike's cush registers jingle a \$2,-500,000 tune.
