# Few Vets Find Homes in U.S., Survey Shows

Oregon veterans' house hunting problems are not unique, according to preliminary reports on a nationwide survey among returning servicemen which have been received by the state department of veterans' affairs.

About three-fifths of the married veterans who were discharged last December were still seeking more suitable living accommodations in early April, the report states.

The survey conducted by the veterans administration among 3000 army and navy enlisted men discharged last December disclosed that only a small part of these men seeking apartments or houses were able to find them and that two-fifths of the married veterans were forced to double up with relatives or friends.

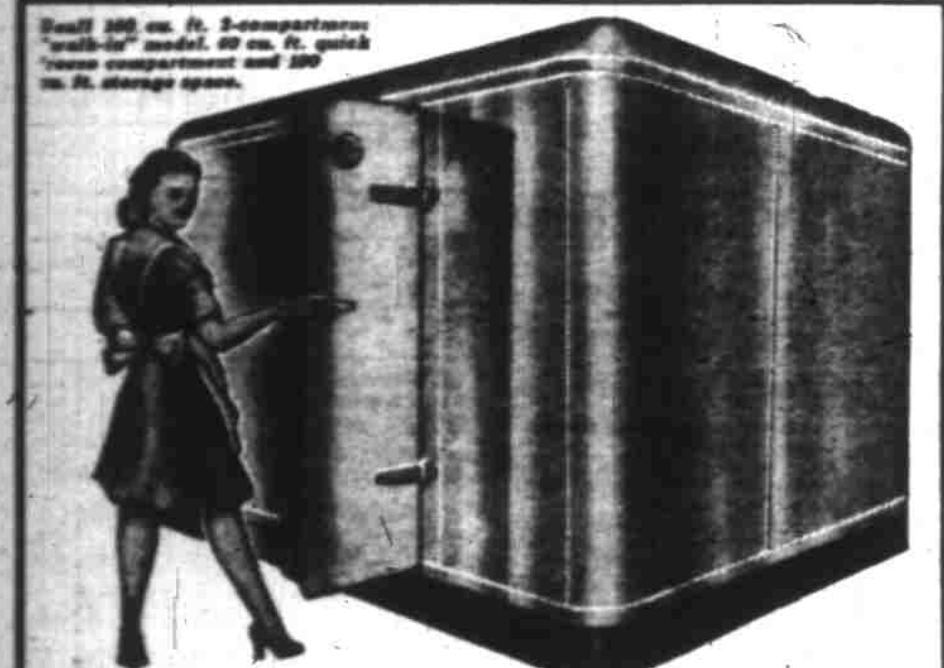
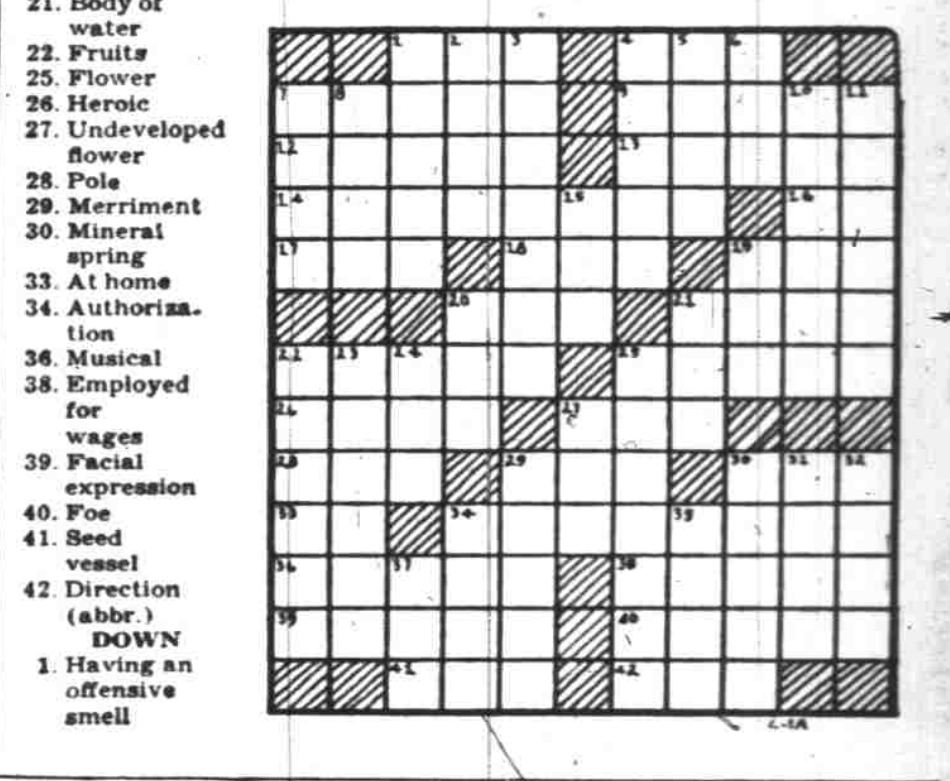
