Seasonal changes included more grass steers, fewer grain fed and fewer dairy type cows. Few good-choice fed steers 17.75; grassers largely 13.00-16.50; for slaughter and as stockers, few up to 17.00 and 17.25, common down to 13.00; fed heifers up to 17.25, most grassers 14.00-15.50; few 16.00 and 16.50; medium-good beef cows 12.00-14.00; few 14.50; canners and cutters 8.00-10.00; good beef bulls 13.25-14.00; odd head 14.25; weavers strong, mostly 17.50-18.00; few 19.50 and odd head 18.00.
Hogs for five days, salable 161, total 2313 compared week ago, market unchanged but strong undertone on feeder pigs, many orders unfilled; barrows and gilts 15.80; sows 15.00; light stags 13.05 with 70 lb. dock; feeder pigs 16.00-25.
Sheep for five days, salable 4240, total 5382. Market strong to higher although top unchanged at 16.00; bulk good-choice spring lambs 15.50-16.00; common-to-medium 12.00-14.00; few feeders 12.50; good-choice old crop short lambs 13.50; odd head 14.00; medium-good predominating at 12.00-13.00; good slaughter ewes 6.50-7.00; extreme top 7.25 for one lot, culls down to 2.00; supply increased due to official announcement of termination of feeder subsidy program as of June 30.
