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Oats Weaken, Close on Loss

CHICAGO, July 12—(AP)—Oats were weak throughout most of the session in the grain market today, closing on losses which extended to more than 2 cents. The July delivery dropped below its former OPA ceiling or selling based mainly on an expansion of offerings of cash oats and a slower demand.

During most of the day corn futures traded well above the previous close, gains extending to 4 1/2 cents, but selling developed at the close in sympathy with the weakness in oats. Gains were wiped out and fractional losses substituted.

At the close oats were 14-2 1/2 lower than yesterday's finish, July 87 1/2-87, and corn was off 1/4-1/2, January 1954. There was no trade in barley.

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
