Road, Bridge Projects to Be Considered

Bids on road and bridge jobs approximating \$3,000,000 will be considered by the state highway commission at a two-day meeting in Portland August 6 and 7. R. H. Baldock, state highway engineer, announced Saturday.

Most of the projects are included in the highway commission's post-war program. They included: Hogg Rock section of the Santiam highway, 23 mile of slide correction in Linn county.

Reconstruct existing bridge over Mill Creek on the Dallas-coast secondary highway near Buell in Polk county.

Three of the projects are in Multnomah county: Front avenue section of the Pacific highway west; Sandy boulevard section of the Columbia river highway; West Gresham section of the Mt. Hood highway.

Other Projects: McNamara Camp - Washburn section of the Wilson river highway, 11.38 miles pavement resurfacing in Tillamook and Washington counties.

Cove-Union section of the Cove secondary highway, 7.80 miles regading, surfacing and oiling in Union county.

Bridge over Rock Creek on Gardner ranch - Berger ranch section of Sunset highway in Washington county.

Forest Grove (main street and college way) section of the Willson river and Nehalem secondary highways, 26 mile of pavement widening.

Cline Falls-Tumalo section of the Cline Falls secondary highway, 10.6 miles of regading, surfacing and oiling in Deschutes county.

Tumalo-Deschutes section of the Tumalo-Deschutes secondary highway, 3.85 miles of regading, surfacing and oiling in Deschutes county.

Dixonville - Marks section of the North Umpqua county road, 7.15 miles of highway widening and 7.84 miles of paving in Douglas county.

\$75,000 Grant For Libraries To Be Asked

The 1947 legislature probably will be asked to approve a state aid grant of \$75,000 for improving and enlarging Oregon libraries, if a proposal of the Oregon State Library association receives approval of the Oregon state library trustees. Miss Eleanor Stephens, state librarian, indicated Saturday.

Miss Stephens said the state aid plan for public libraries had been adopted in several states the past few years. The state of Washington last year approved a budget of \$283,000 for public libraries in addition to its regular state library budget, she said.
