

74 Small Type Planes Offered In Two Sales

PORTLAND, Aug. 1—Seventy-four surplus liaison and other personal-type planes and transport aircraft will be offered in two special sales at fixed prices beginning August 12 and 19, the Portland War Assets office announced today. Priority buyers will have first chance to buy the planes.

The planes to be offered include Beechcrafts, Stinsons, Howards Fairchilds, Wacos, Cessnas, Grumman's, Douglas's, Lockheed's and Pipers. All have been used.

In the first sale, starting August 12, 54 planes are offered at storage fields in Dos Palos and Ontario, Calif., Augusta, Ga., Camden, S.C., and Honolulu, T. H. The eight in Hawaii have been especially priced because of their location. The second sale, beginning August 19, offers 20 planes at Yukon, Okla., and Ft. Worth, Tex.

The Portland office also received word of 350 surplus Fairchild 1726 primary trainers being put up for sale at Niagara Falls, N. Y. Fixed prices range from \$990 to \$2,800, depending upon condition.

Selling Causes Drop in Grains

CHICAGO, Aug. 1—(AP)—Persistent commission house selling caused a reversal in price trends in the grain pits today after both corn and oats had displayed strength in the early trading.

Prices of the yellow grain advanced around 3 cents at one time, January getting above its former OPA ceiling of \$1.46 1/2, but fairly large selling orders were encountered at the peak.

There has been a little more activity in feed barley futures, at advancing prices, over the past few sessions. A small barley crop is expected this year.
