Heirens' Crimes Preventable, Oregon Sociologist Declares

A maladjusted youth whose crimes are as extreme as the three brutal murders recently confessed by 17-year-old William Heirens in Chicago is not beyond reform. Salem Rotarians heard Wednesday from Walter R. Argow, consulting sociologist of Portland and former staff member of a New York state training school.

Correction of young Heirens would require considerable time, for he is virtually an adult, the luncheon speaker asserted.

What is more important, Argow added, is the lack of preventive treatment which might have converted Heirens into a normal member of society, had his case been given proper attention when he first appeared as a delinquent before juvenile authorities at the age of 13 or 14.

The Heirens case demonstrates that modern society does not have adequate facilities for handling delinquents, especially since Chicago is considered the most advanced center for juvenile correctional work in this country, Argow declared. As far as institutions and corrective procedure are concerned there is still far too little remedial treatment of offenders and far too much vindictive punishment, he said.

Delinquency, while clearly a symptom of personal maladjustment and an index of an unhealthy society in the opinion of the sociologist, is hardly as serious and widespread as many statistics and much publicity of certain cases would indicate, said Argow. Three variables in such statistics, as listed by the sociologist, are the types and frequency of offenses, the efficiency of enforcement agencies in apprehending offenders of larceny by bailer, sentenced to 16 days in the county jail.
