

More Women Are Needed in Pear Canning

Pear canning operations are increasing the demand for women workers in the mid-valley canneries, the Salem Canners committee said Thursday.

Mont Foods, Paulus Bros., Producers Cooperative, Reid, Murdoch and Co., and Birds Eye-Strider of Woodburn are beginning their pear packs.

Pears are a large part of Oregon's fruit crop, the committee pointed out. The 1946 harvest for the state was 4,273,000 bushels. The 1946 crop is estimated at not less. In addition, many pears grown in Washington are canned in Salem plants. This industry requires the work of many women. The pears are balled, peeled, and seeded by machine, but the fruit is trimmed by women workers and then placed in cans by hand.

Pear and beef canning are in full swing in many of the valley plants. Mrs. Verla Bennett, chairman of the Salem Canners committee and personnel manager for Blue Lake Producers, is urging that women who can work now in the food processing industry of this area get in touch with the U. S. employment service or call at a canner.
