## Big Jumbo Shrimp in Fish-man's Shop Attract Family Cook of a Friday

Perhaps you've seen, and wondered about those greenish gray shrimplike things in the fish man's window, and considered buying a few to try. Well they are well worth it, prawns or lorge shrimp, raw rather than boiled as the small shrimp are usually seen.

There are many ways to cook prawns, which have a similar but not-the-same flavor as the ready-cooked shrimp. Some like to dip them in batter and fry in shallow or deep fat. Some like shrimp together with toothpick to merely saute them and then Dip in batter.
