### City Council Adopts Five New Ordinances in Final Voting

(Story also on Page 1) Five of 13 ordinance bills considered last night by the Salem city council in its regular semi-monthly accumulation of city business became ordinances upon final adoption in the council session at city hall.

Besides two ordinances which place "clarifying" charter amendments before the public in the November 5 election in preparation for the advent of city administration in Salem next year, the council passed these three ordinances:

Extension of ward 6 and ward 7 boundaries to take in recently annexed city territory.

Increase of city employees' salaries, as provided in the 1946-47 city budget.

Vacation of an unused portion of Turner road to permit expansion of the W. W. Rosebraugh foundry.

Annexation problems figured also in two other matters, one resulting in a council decision to expedite a water system survey by having its public utilities committee recommend at the next meeting an outside engineer qualified to make the survey, and the other a council directive that the city engineer erect speed limit signs at the new city limits.

The Parrish garage controversy flared again last night when Charles Heltzel, representing the property owner, appeared to ask the council to delay action on its directive that two gas pumps be removed from the street and curb be installed, until the time is more opportune for erecting a new garage building.

Alfred Mundt, representing the city, maintained that his committee had thoroughly studied the North Capitol street problem, considered it a traffic hazard and placed the safety of passers-by above the business interest involved.

Council voted to enforce its directive, to be carried out in 10 days.
