

# State Employee Groups Urge 40-Hour Week

Time and a half pay for overtime work and a five-day 40-hour week for state employees were urged Monday by delegations from the Oregon State Employees Association, the American Federation of Labor and other groups which appeared before the state employment commission in public hearing on the new state civil service requirements.

At the conclusion of the conference with the civil service commission a delegation representing the employment service employees conferred with Gov. Earl Snell. Neither Snell nor the employment service representatives would comment on what transpired at the conference.

It also was asked at the hearing that the vacation time for public employees be increased from one day a month, which is accumulative, to two days a month, or 24 days a year. The argument was advanced that many large corporations already have adopted the 40-hour five-day week with the result that they are receiving more efficiency from their workers and have increased rather than lowered production.
