Industrial Building in Oregon Cut 30 Per Cent

PORTLAND, Aug. 30 (AP)—Oregon and six southwest Washington counties in the Oregon civilian production administration district will be allowed only about \$350,000 weekly on the average of non-residential construction under the new cutback.

Nelson English, head of CPA here, said the new figure represents a cut of from 25 to 30 per cent.

World Air Speed Mark Broken Unofficially

MUROC, Calif., Aug. 30 (AP)—An army P-84 Thunderjet fighter has established an unofficial world's speed record over a measured course at Murroc air field—608 miles an hour. The mark will not be recognized, army officials disclosed, because it is necessary to better the existing record of 806 miles by five miles an hour.

Action Speeded On Forestry Board Findings

Virtually every recommendation for forest conservation and fire protection made in the report of Gov. Earl Snell's special forestry committee, with the exception of those requiring legislation, are already being put into operation or are well under way, the governor declared Friday.

Snell said that with the exception of the recommended creation of a department of conservation and a corporation to raise \$25,000,000 in forestry bonds, neither of which were recommended unanimously, the forestry board and state forester have been working on suggestions contained in the report.

In line with the recommendation for fire protection of the Tillamook burn area, Gov. Snell reported that the forestry department has planned effective measures of protecting the burn.

One of the reseeding experiments, involving the use of airplanes in restocking the land, was not a complete success, he said, but another method has been developed, involving the use of a locally invented tree-planter which will increase the efficiency of one man by 500 to 600 per cent in each day's planting. Another machine, now under development, would prepare as many as 200,000 small trees for planting each day from the state's nurseries.

Hop Harvest Ready Monday

Picking of late hops will be in full swing by Monday, and good picking is in store because this week's light rains have loosened hops on the vines, the farm labor office in Salem indicated yesterday.

Thousands of harvest workers are needed in the Salem-Independence area during the first two weeks of September when hop, bean and prune picking all will be in progress, the office stated. Lewonia Murham, 18, of Route 3, Salem, has averaged \$1.50 an hour every day since August 19, picking early hops at Roger & Bishop yards on the South River road, farm labor officials said.

Test Pilot Killed In Crash Into Lake

LEWISTON, N. Y., Aug. 30 (AP)—Jack Woolams, 29, Bell Aircraft's chief test pilot and nationally known speed flyer, was killed today when his souped-up P-39 Airacobra crashed into Lake Ontario. Bell officials reported Woolams had placed second among the qualifiers for the Thompson air race and had been assigned by the army to attempt to fly a plane into the supersonic speed range for the first time later this summer.

Elderly Man Hit in Woodburn Mishap

Thomas B. Moore, 811 Front st., Woodburn, an elderly pedestrian, was injured last evening when he was struck by a car driven by Alan Slahaugh, route 1, Hubbard. It was reported by state police they said the accident occurred in Woodburn at the intersection of Pacific highway and Young street. Attaches at Woodburn hospital, where the injured man was taken, said his condition was fair and full extent of his injuries had not yet been determined by midnight.

Wage Rate Set for Prune, Plum Crop

Wage ceiling rates for prune and plum harvesting in Washington, Yamhill, Marion and Polk counties have been established as the result of a recent wage board meeting. It was announced here Friday.

The new schedule provides a maximum rate of 25 cents per lug box of 56 pounds for picking plums or prunes from the ground, 35 cents per lug box of 56 pounds for picking and shaking plums or prunes, with the maximum rate of \$1 an hour for other harvest labor.

PAY \$187.00 a month for beginners. Athletic tests as would be ordinarily used in fire fighting.

REQUIREMENTS Applicants must have been bona fide residents of the City of Salem for at least one year immediately previous to the date of the examination and must be registered voters.

Age limits are from 21 to 31 years. Applicants who are placed on the eligible list will be required to take a physical examination from the city physician before appointment. Poor health or disabling defects reported by the city physician will be cause for removal from the eligible list.
