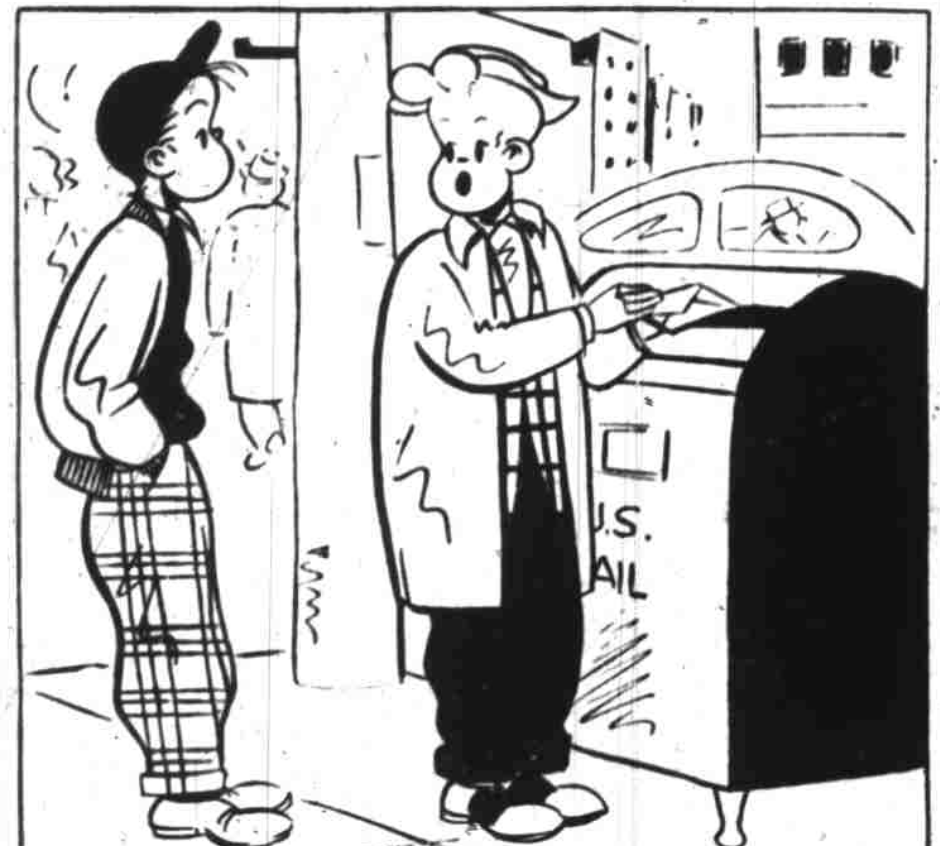

Colation jumpers class was the first event on the Sunday night show with Kitty Higgins, owned by Fraser of Billings and ridden by Bert Colby, won a first again in three-gaited horses, open class. Second was Ross Arden's Heather Lass, owned and ridden by Emily Gay of Seattle. Third went to Roy Vencador, owned by Columbia Riding Academy.

Ivar Morgan of Salem riding his own horse, Ima Flash, won the blue ribbon in the fine harness horses, open class; second to R. B. Fraser of Billings, driven by Burt Corby; third, The Golden Key, owned by Arthur L. Mason of Tigard and Joe Bob Price driving Bourbons Black Magic, owned and driven by Mrs. N. DeLaitre of Oswego took fourth.

Tennessee Walking Horses event was won by Gray Eagle, owned by Mrs. S. Stonebrink of Portland and ridden by Loren Kerr; second place to Last Chance Allen, owned by Mrs. S. Stonebrink of Portland, ridden by Elizabeth Swett; third was Lou Jane Allen, owner, Vern Smith of Washougal, rider, Mrs. M. R. Wells.
