Stocks Enjoy Upward Push

NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (AP)—Stocks enjoyed a selective upward push in today's market although demand was relatively timid and dealings the slowest of the week. The recovery shift got under way at the start with assorted steels, motors, rubbers, mail orders and "blue chip" industrials in front for gains of 1 to 3 points or so by midday. A few "thin" issues jumped 4 to 12 on meager sales. While extreme advances were shaded here, a number of favorites ended at the day's tops. Transfers of 1,710,000 shares compared with 1,980,000 Thursday.

Buying Move Lifts Grains

CHICAGO, Sept. 13 (AP)—A buying movement developed in grain futures today. Wheat paced the upturn as trading volume expanded from the listless level of recent sessions. There was also a stronger market for cash grain. Wheat was a cent higher in the spot market while a leading industry raised bids on new crop corn as much as 10 cents a bushel over yesterday's late prices. Wheat finished 1 1/4-2 1/2 higher, January \$1.37, corn was up 1 1/2-2 cents, January \$1.33 1/2, and oats were ahead 1/4-1 1/2. September 79 1/4-1/2. March barley sold at \$1.40 1/2, up 2 1/2. Heavy flour business at new ceilings, leading traders to expect an increase demand for cash wheat from Mills, was a major factor in the bread cereal upturn. An added stimulus was provided by news that the Omaha and Kansas City CCC offices had purchased some export wheat overnight.
