### Driver Sentenced for Negligent Homicide In July 20 Accident

Richard Cannon, Idanha, pleaded guilty before Circuit Judge E. M. Page Thursday to a negligent homicide charge and was sentenced to two years in the state prison and fined \$1,000. He was paroled from the prison sentence to the U. S. army and the fine was suspended.

### Cannon was indicted August 23 by the Marion county grand jury in connection with the death of Larry Vaughn Collins, 11, who was struck by a car reportedly driven by Cannon on July 20 near Idanha. The indictment alleged that liquor was involved and that the car's headlights were defective.
