Ranch Ramblings

What's the matter with our Oregon judges? Going over the list of the 19 selected for the Grand National Livestock exposition in the San Francisco Cow Palace November 15 to 24, I find none from Oregon, 13 from California, two from Iowa, and one each from Idaho, Oklahoma, Colorado and Wisconsin. Returning to the national livestock show circuit after a wartime lapse of five years, the Grand National this year will offer more than \$106,000 in premiums. Oregon will be represented, even though not in judging.

First "big name" speaker scheduled to address the national grange session to be held in Portland, November 13 to 22, is Clinton Anderson, U. S. secretary of agriculture. Plans are that he will give the address on the morning of November 15.

The large percentage of Willamette valley and other potato seed fields turned down for certification on first and second inspections this season, because of disease percentages above certification requirements, serves to illustrate the constant battle of farmers with disease and insect pests. Constant vigilance and roguing are essential if spread of potato diseases is to be combated. In addition to other troubles, two more diseases, ring rot and a new kind of wilt, have appeared during recent years to harass local growers. J. J. Inskeep, county agent in Clackamas county, is planning an all-day potato growers' disease clinic this winter to better acquaint growers with these potato disease problems.

Henry Davenport of Mt. Angel and William Davenport of Scotts Mills, cousins, brought back 22 head of Cheviot sheep from the Frazier river country in Canada. The two men were accompanied by L. J. Davenport, father of William. Weather was ideal, they said, but scarce things were just as scarce across the border as here.
